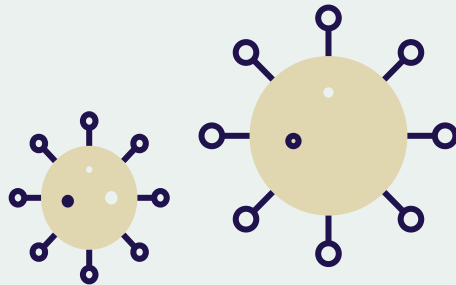

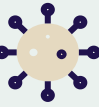

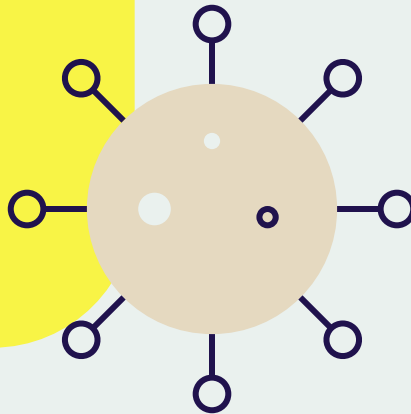

**Testing Positive for COVID-19 or Coming into
Contact with Someone Who Has**

CONTACT TRACER

Contact tracing is used by health departments to prevent the spread of infectious disease. In general, contact tracing involves identifying people who have an infectious disease (cases) and people who they came in contact with (contacts) and working with them to interrupt disease spread. This includes asking people with COVID-19 to [isolate](#) and their contacts to [quarantine](#) at home voluntarily.

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER

Community Health Workers (CHWs) are trusted members of the neighborhoods where they serve. They are trained lay people who provide education, guidance and social support, while serving as a liaison for health care providers and social services. CHWs share a connection with their communities because they understand the culture and language where they live and work.

PROCESS FOR TESTING AND FOLLOW-UP

PRE -TEST

If you have symptoms or are informed by Contact Tracer that you may have been exposed by someone who tested POSITIVE

TEST

Make an Appointment with appropriate Testing Site.

FOLLOW UP

1st Notification: You will receive a call from a lab with your results

FOLLOW UP

2nd Notification: You will receive a call from a Contact Tracer from the UDOH

FOLLOW UP

3rd Notification: Community Health Worker

FOLLOW UP

Last: Your Provider will advise you on next steps

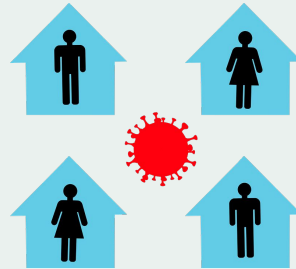
KEY DEFINITIONS

Isolation and quarantine help protect the public by preventing exposure to people who have or may have a contagious disease.



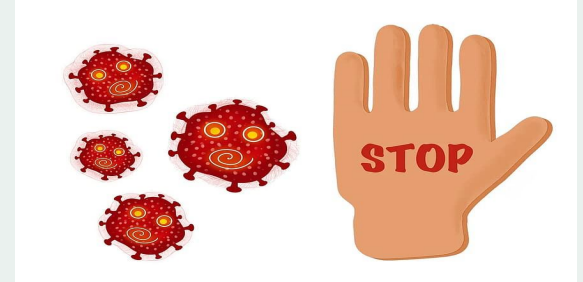
QUARANTINE

Separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick.



ISOLATION

Separates sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.



CLEARED

Each case is unique. Please follow the orders of your physician and be honest in your reporting.
